FROM THE CLUB PRESIDENT

Use of the Members' Lounge

Over the summer months it was disappointing to hear negative comments by a few members in regard to functions being held in the clubhouse and the need to have Saturday golf presentations in the Members' Lounge.

At the Annual General Meeting held in February I addressed the issue of functions and the use of the Members' Lounge. Joanne Smith, our Functions Co-ordinator has worked tirelessly to attract functions to our club and the income generated has significantly improved our financial position. In the first five months of our financial year to the end of February, function activities generated gross income of \$79,752 and a nett result of \$23,925. Although the next few months are traditionally 'quiet times' for the club, we have still attracted a number of functions and conferences, generating additional income. With the current economic climate the club has to examine all avenues of income, and functions will continue to be a major income source in the future.

At times of maximum capacity with the use of our clubhouse for weddings and other activities, members will be obliged to use the Members' Lounge for Saturday golf presentations. At present it is estimated that the Members' Lounge would be in use on six or seven occasions per year, during the summer season. I believe this is a small inconvenience to members in view of the income achieved, which ultimately strengthens the club's sustainability for the future.

Attitudes

Another concern is the attitude some members have displayed to our staff on occasions. It has been reported to me that staff have been verbally abused or ridiculed by members. Other incidences of snide remarks or innuendo being made when staff walk past tables in the clubhouse have also been noted.

I remind members that our staff go about doing their job in a responsible and respectful manner and deserved to be treated by our membership with respect. If a member has a complaint regarding the club's employees or contractors such concerns must be made to the Club Manager and not to the staff member directly. I refer members to page 16 of the Members Handbook, '*Complaints*'.

I regret that if a member continues to adopt the above attitude toward staff

by making direct or indirect comments about their duties, which are endorsed by Committee of Management, that member will receive a warning. If further occurrences continue the member will be invited to attend a Committee of Management Meeting to be held accountable for their attitude and behaviour.

Big Al

On a more pleasant note, I am pleased to welcome Big Al to the kitchen. He comes to us with a wealth of experience and operates his own businesses. Members and visitors who have sampled his meals over the past few weeks are full of praise for the quality and presentation of food. With a new menu and mouth watering choices a meal at the club's Bistro in the near future must be a priority.

Ladies Captain

In early May, Linda Hodgson tendered her resignation as Ladies Captain to the Committee of Management. The Committee thanked Linda for the contribution she made on committee and to the role of Ladies Captain and wishes her well in her endeavours in the future.

As a result of this vacancy Val Wyld was appointed as Ladies Captain for the duration of the 2-year term. Val has the full support of Committee of Management and I encourage all members of the club, in particular our lady members to support and assist Val in her role. Val has recently 'recruited' a number of ladies to her Match Sub Committee and I wish all the ladies well in their endeavours in their roles and offer my support and that of the members of Committee of Management.

Changes for the Future

Change is a constant companion that we have at these times. The club is continually going through a change process. The Committee of Management's role is to make decisions for the long term future and sustainability of our golf club. Sometimes decisions made by the Committee of Management may not sit well with some of our members. Gary Player when he attended *Augusta National* for *The Masters* this year, noted the changes that had been made and stated that "Change is the price of survival". I believe this statement to be true and know that we as the Victor Harbor Golf Club cannot dwell on the past, nor can we return to the way it was, at our own peril or demise. As a golf club we must continue to change and adapt to new situations and challenges as they are presented.

I ask the membership to adopt a positive approach, enjoy playing golf and

the after match activities in the clubhouse and to adopt the following ethic:

“Think Not What The Golf Club Can Do For You,

Think What You Can Do For The Golf Club”

With this approach we will meet all forthcoming challenges and ensure the long term viability and sustainability of our Golf Club for future generations.

MANAGER'S REPORT

Legal Obligations

Recently I attended a Regional Meeting of Club's SA at which were discussed a number of new statutory obligations for clubs.

Liquor Licensing Act 1997

Effective 5th May 2010 the following amendment come into force:

The definition of intoxication has been clarified to make it clearer for responsible persons to identify intoxicated persons.

Under the definition, in circumstances where a patron's speech, balance, co-ordination or behaviour is noticeably impaired and it is reasonable to believe that the impairment is the result of the consumption of alcohol the responsible person serving alcohol must not continue to serve or allow other persons to purchase alcohol on their behalf.

Staff in this club will be made aware of these changes and current practices will be adjusted to meet the requirements of the Act.

The consequences of this change are obvious - members (patrons) deemed intoxicated by our staff should not seek to acquire further alcohol. And it is expected members (patrons) will respect the role staff play in this process.

Tax obligations on Not for Profit Clubs

Following a review by the Productivity Commission into the contribution of the *Not for Profit* sector, there has been significant pressure applied to the Government to have clubs such as ours taxed on non core club activities e.g. income from weddings etc.

Many clubs rely on this extra income to survive and any changes to the current practices will obviously place further cost pressures on clubs.

Subscriptions

We are fast approaching the time of the year when subscriptions are due. Committee is currently going through the budget processes for next year and it is expected the subscriptions will be released early July for payment by 1st October 2010. Your cooperation in paying your subscriptions prior to the due date would be appreciated. As with last year playing rights will be suspended from 1st October if subscriptions are not paid.

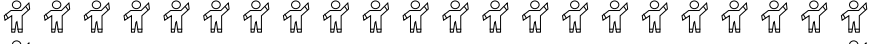
Any ideas for meals? I would love to hear what you would like to see in our bistro. Feel free to drop in a note or see me for a chat.

Once again a big thank you to my lovely members who continue to volunteer in the kitchen and bar and all those other little helpers around the clubhouse.

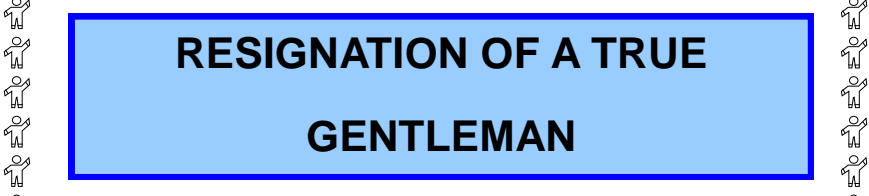
STAFF HARASSMENT

MONEY MATTERS

Although the AGM. was only two months ago we have, as at the 31st March, actually completed the first six months of the Club's fiscal or financial year. It is therefore considered appropriate to advise members of the financial situation as at the end of that six months.

General operations of the club during the six months have resulted in a surplus of \$76,000 which I am pleased to report is approximately \$47,000 more than the budgeted surplus for the period.

This result has been due to:

- Increase in Subscriptions and the Course Levy payments
- Increase in Green Fees received
- Increase in bar sales and percentage profit (approx \$10,000)

Significant savings made in all areas of expenditure

This favourable result has been achieved although the Kitchen/Catering function recorded a loss of some \$14,500. Although this result was an improvement of \$8,500 over the previous year for the same period it is still of some concern.

Your committee along with the Functions Manager, Joanne, continues to review the day to day operations of this facility and members will have no doubt noticed certain changes introduced .

It has also been ascertained that the favourable bar takings (with sales up by 4%) have in no small way been influenced by increased wedding and private functions catered for by the club.

Capital expenditure has been restricted to \$23,000 as follows:

● TVs for the members lounge and main room	\$5,000
● Card printer for the Pro Shop	\$1,500
● Deep fryer and miscellaneous items for the kitchen	\$3,500
● Construction of the members lounge with air conditioner	<u>\$13,000</u>

TROLLEY TRIVIA

Living near Woolworths has been pretty chaotic during the construction of Big W and whilst the car park has been under construction, shoppers have been parking in side streets like Burke Street where Peggy and I live. Many people have trundled their trolleys down the street to their cars and then left them there. I have now discovered *TROLLEY TRACKER!* It's a web site where you can report the abandoned trolleys and then go into a monthly draw to win \$1000! The site covers the whole of Australia for many of the big stores and I have now seen these amazing statistics:

Woolworths, Safeway and Big W stores have around 300,000 shopping trolleys in over 900 stores around Australia. Hundreds of contractors and staff ensure trolleys are available for customers. The cost of collecting, maintaining and replacing trolleys each year is over \$50 million. Approximately 5% of all trolleys are replaced each year either because they go missing, are stolen or damaged beyond repair. The average trolley costs \$150 to replace, however trolleys with special features (such as child seats) can cost up to \$600.

Shopping trolleys have an uncanny ability to become feral if left abandoned. One trolley from Lismore in northern New South Wales was recovered in Cairns, 1,500 kilometres away.

Another trolley from Port Augusta was found at Cook, on the Nullarbor, 870 kilometres along the Trans-Continental Railway. (Railway staff kindly sent it home!).
